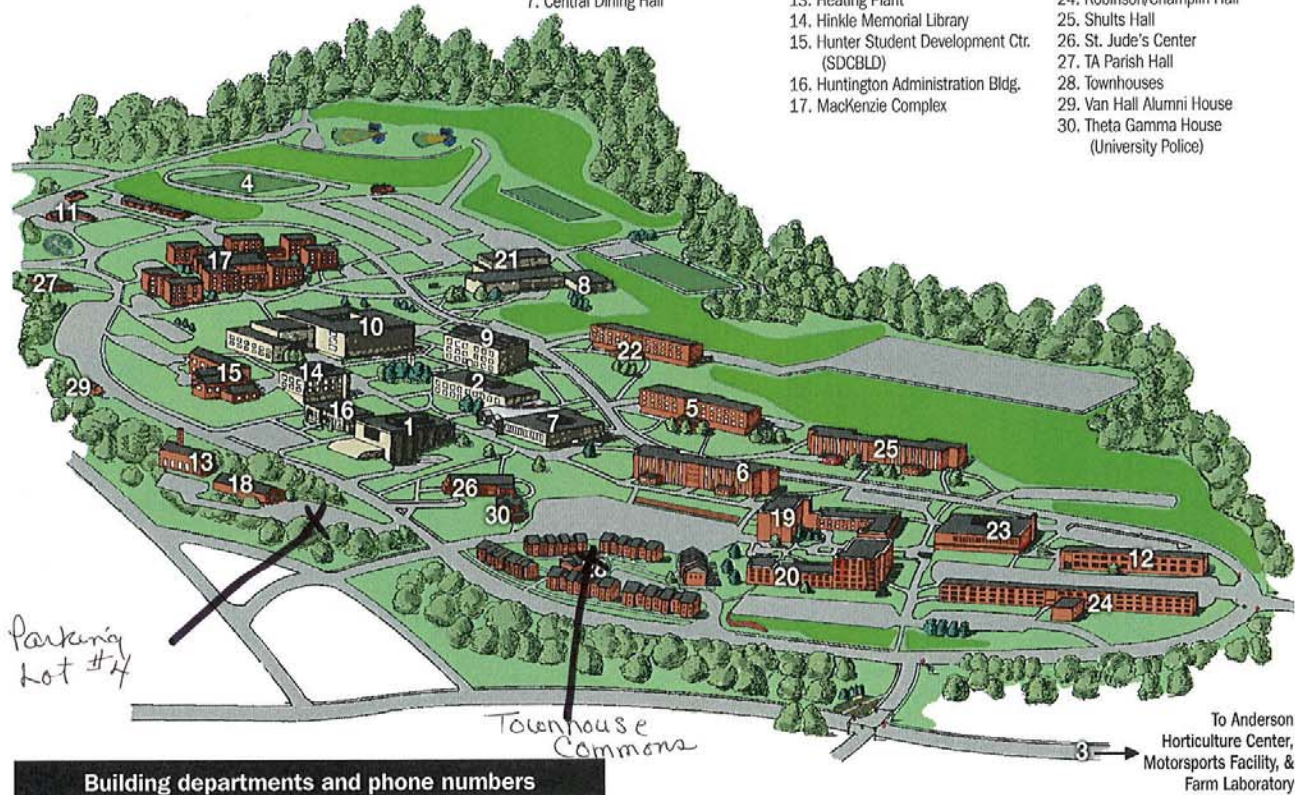

Directions to Alfred State College

From the East

Take Route 86 West (Southern Tier Expressway).
Exit #33 at Almond. Follow signs along Route 21 and
244 into Alfred.
**Approximately two hours' driving time from Binghamton.*

From the West

Take Route 86 East (Southern Tier Expressway).
Exit #30 at Belmont. Follow signs for Route 19 South
into Belmont. Turn left onto Route 244. At stop sign turn
right onto Main Street.
**Approximately 2 hours' driving time from Jamestown.*

From Rochester (North)

Take Route 390 South, Exit #4 Dansville to Route 36.
Continue south on Route 36 through Arkport to Route 86
West (Southern Tier Expressway). Exit #33 at Almond.
Follow signs along Route 21 and 244 into Alfred.
**Approximately 1 ½ hours' driving time from Rochester.*

Entrance to Campus

- Please use the Main Entrance to Campus
- At the stop sign, turn left on to Lower College Drive; continue up the loop road until you reach **Commuter Lot 4** (*recommended lot*) on the right where the Main Attraction Building is located; or you may park in any other student lot close to the Town House Commons
