Chapter 27 Managing Pesticides Wastes

- A pesticide becomes a waste when:
 - It has served its originally intended purpose
 - You intend to discard it
- State & Federal regulations make <u>you</u> responsible for the proper disposal of pesticide wastes that you generate.

Container Disposal

- After triple rinsing
- Return them to the dealer
- Recycle at pesticide container drive NOT with other recyclables
- Bring them to a chemical collection drive
- Take to an approved disposal facility
- "Storage & Disposal" section on label



Landfill Disposal

- Any non-hazardous pesticide waste
- However, they are not required to accept such wastes.
- Liable for future problems
- Liquid pesticide wastes are NOT accepted

Hazardous Waste

 Classified by the EPA under the Resource Conservation & Recovery Act



- A waste is considered hazardous if it has:
 - certain chemical characteristics
 - poses human health problems
 - substantial risk to the environment
- Have special handling, transport, disposal requirements
 - Check with state pesticide and waste disposal agencies
